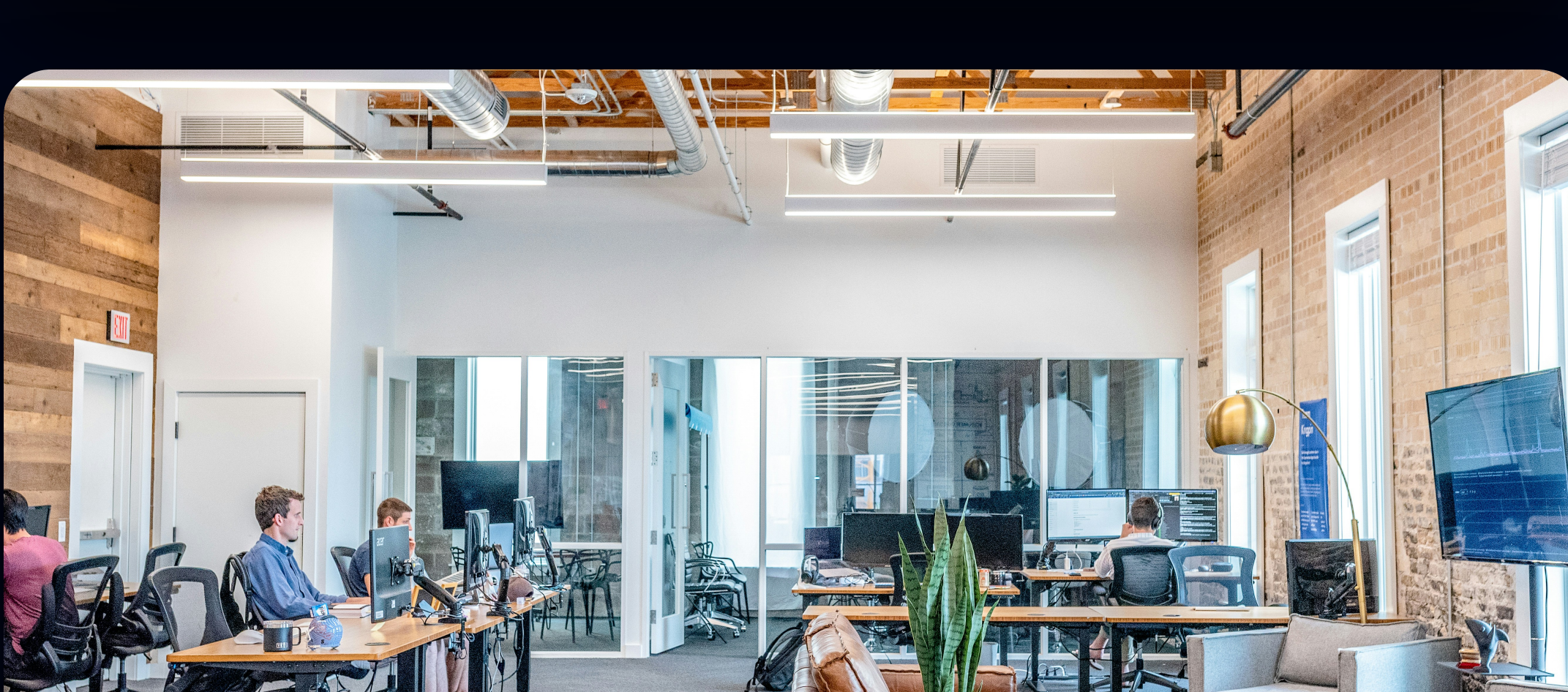
Opportunities and Structural Limitations
